



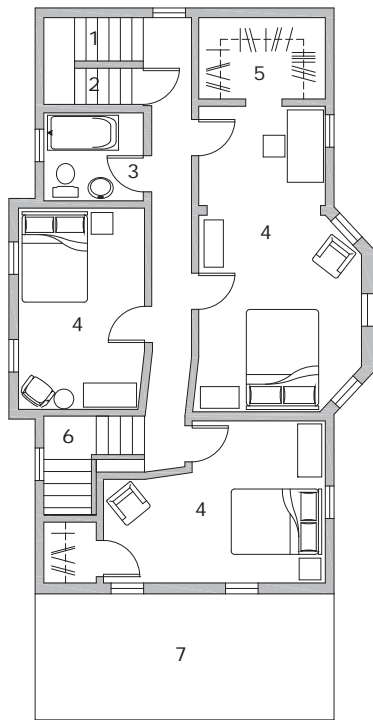
GENEVA'S HOUSES

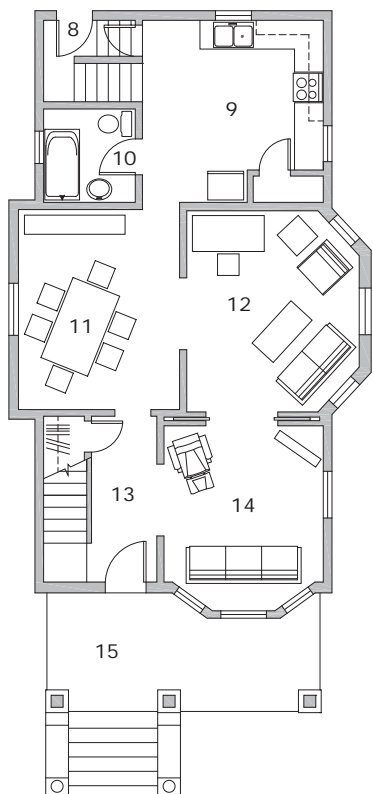

But you also know that these houses are the ones with the character, the stories and that something extra that makes people want to turn them into *homes*.



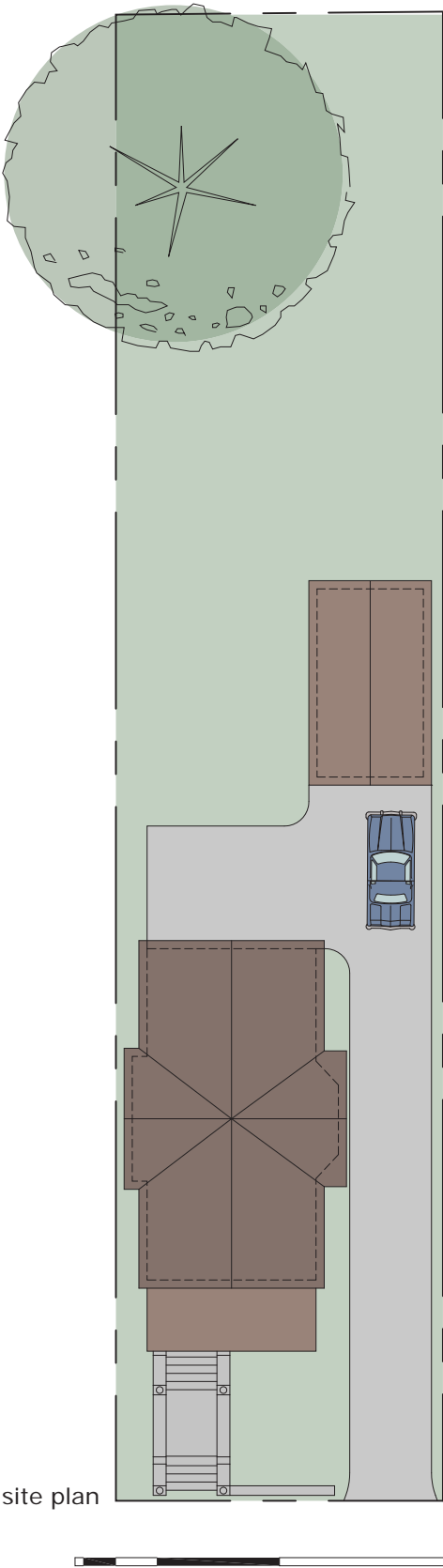
second floor plan
